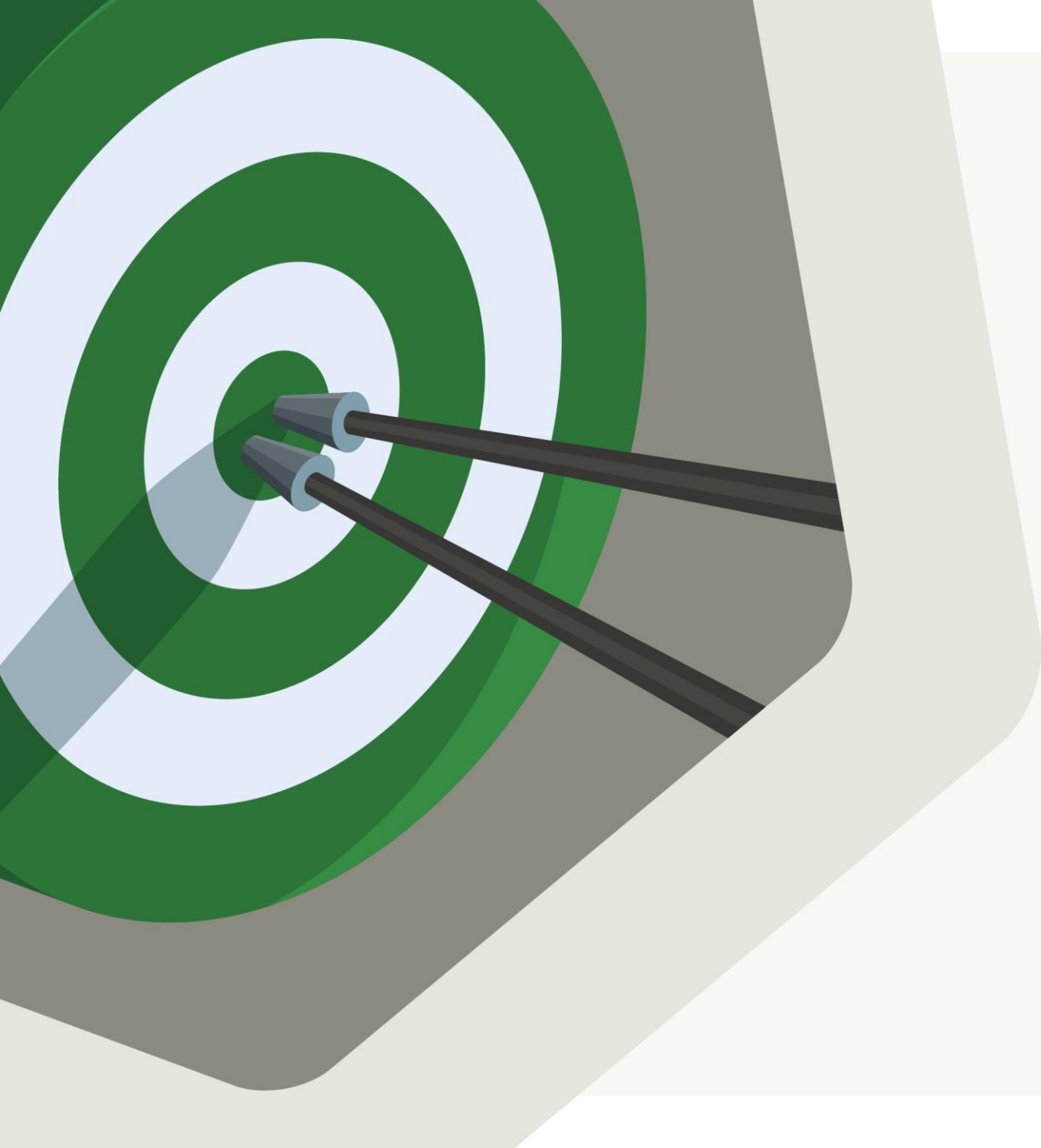

POLICY OBJECTIVES (CONT'D)

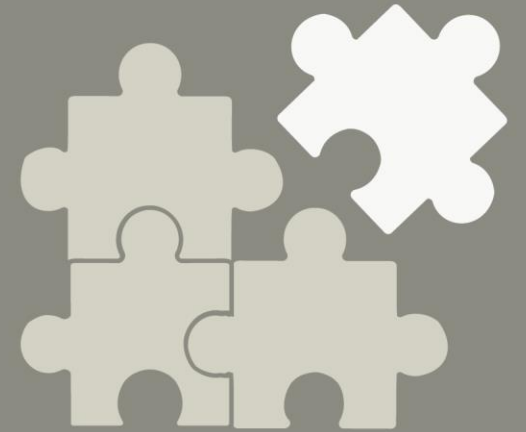
WHY POPULATION POLICY?



To promote policies and interventions that address morbidities and mortalities across all the segments of the population to improve longevity/life expectancy;



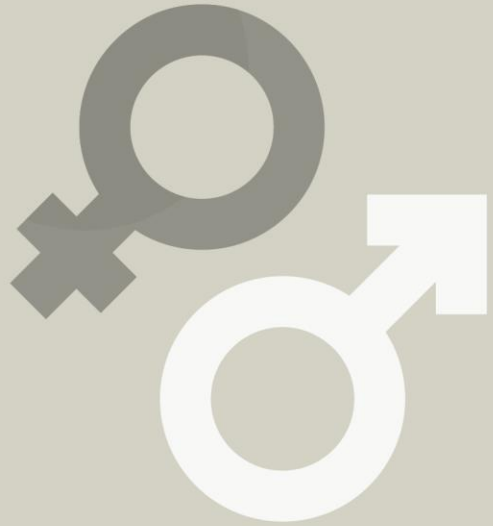
To address challenges and maximize opportunities arising from mobility, migration and urbanization to achieve national development aspirations;
